SUBJECT: Sport Tourism Strategy Update

RECOMMENDATION

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department recommends that Council:

1. Receive this report for information; and

2. Approve the updated Sport Tourism Strategy, attached as Appendix "I".

INTENT

The purpose of this report is to inform Council about the updated Sport Tourism Strategy (the "Strategy") and seek Council approval of the Strategy. A secondary purpose is to highlight major sport hosting events secured for 2025, along with current bid opportunities that staff are actively exploring, attached as Appendix "II".

BACKGROUND

In 2013, Council adopted a Sport Tourism Strategy to position Surrey as a leader in the sport tourism industry. The strategy aims to maximize economic benefits and to provide sport development opportunities for residents and local community clubs. 'Sport Tourism Events' are defined as events where both participants and spectators travel over 80 kilometers to attend and stay overnight.

As the City of Surrey continues to position itself as a premier sports hosting destination and the Sport Tourism Grant Program continues to receive high demand and utilization, updates to the Strategy are essential to ensure it remains current, innovative and effective. The updated Strategy was presented at the Parks, Recreation, and Sports Tourism Committee ("PRSTC") on November 6, 2024, where it received the committee's support and endorsement.

DISCUSSION

To maximize economic benefits for the City of Surrey, a structured Request for Proposal ("RFP") process has been established to encourage participants to stay in hotels within city limits. City staff use a specialized platform called SimpleView, which is accessible to hoteliers throughout Surrey. Through this platform, staff input details such as dates of stay, pricing guidelines, room quantities, total room nights, and any specific accommodations needed. This allows hotels to

efficiently respond to user group needs and engage with participants directly to secure room blocks.

Through the City of Surrey's Sports Tourism Canada ("STC") membership, city staff utilize a comprehensive application called the Sports Tourism Economic Assessment Model ("STEAM") which measures post-event analysis, incorporating event performance indicators, visitor metrics, and economic benefits. STEAM reporting estimated a total of \$10,296,377 of Gross Domestic Product ("GDP") in Surrey from Sport Tourism Events in 2024.

The strategy displays updated capital investments in sport facilities, provides a comprehensive and accurate list of available venues; and underscores the City's commitment to unique emerging sports, such as E-Sports, reflecting a modernized approach to sports tourism. The strategy is used as an important tool when exploring sport hosting opportunities that align with current city initiatives and amenity capacities. Updating the strategy supports the growth of the City's sport hosting portfolio and references the invaluable investments the City is making to ensure it continues to be a leader in the sector.

Upcoming Sport Tourism Events and Bid Updates

To date, 16 major Sport Tourism Events have been successfully secured for 2025, with more expected through upcoming bids and annual recurring events. The City continues to be a desirable destination for organizations seeking to host Sport Tourism Events due to the quality and accessibility of city facilities. As the City continues to prioritize capital investments in sport facilities and amenities, the development of sport hosting opportunities will expand, enabling a greater and more significant economic impact.

CONCLUSION

The Parks, Recreation & Culture Department recommends that Council endorse the updated Sport Tourism Strategy. Sport Tourism Events not only foster a healthy and engaged community, but also provide a significant positive economic impact on the City of Surrey.





Develop and support recurring events to strengthen capacity within Surrey.

Capital Investment in Sports Facilities

Enhance Surrey's infrastructure to host premier sporting events by investing in new facilities and upgrading existing ones. This includes the newly approved third synthetic Field Hockey turf at Tamanawis Park, the new Bear Creek Stadium, a covered lacrosse box at South Surrey Athletic Park, and the Cloverdale Sport & Ice Complex, which will feature three new sheets of ice.

These improvements will boost the city's capacity to accommodate top-tier athletic events and attract more visitors.

Strategically enhance new and existing parks and facilities to support tournament hosting.
